THE LOCATION

The Angel Hotel, Castle Street, Cardiff CF10 1SZ

The festival's home for 2025 is the iconic Angel Hotel. Opened in 1883, the hotel features 102 bedrooms, situated directly between Cardiff Castle and the Principality Stadium. Since opening, the hotel has welcomed some famous faces with Greta Garbo, The Beatles and Anthony Perkins all reportedly being guests of the hotel. Also, the office of the Lord Chamberlain was situated here for 4 days during the Queen's Silver Jubilee in 1977, whilst the Queen toured Cardiff and South Wales.





Music Video: Anna Arietta


Anna is a filmmaker and musician, and is the Director of Production and Operations at It's My Shout.





